Gaps in Educational Services – What is happening at the legislative level?  
All schools have an IEP plan for a student that the district needs to meet. Most districts are only reimbursed a small amount for Special Education which comes from the general education fund and it is a tough position to be in. The state is putting more into mental health funding, but educational needs go up much faster. It is also difficult to find providers to meet those needs. The State is working to revamp reading in Wisconsin. Rep. Kitchens noted “we learn to read, then read to learn.” Research shows if children cannot read by 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, they have a higher likelihood of ending up in jail or prison.

- ✓ Introduction of New Committee Members  
Mary Hurley is a grandmother/caregiver of her two grandsons who were enrolled in both CCS and CLTS programming.
- ✓ Staffing Updates  
There will be two CLTS workers leaving this year. Katie Moore’s last day will be April 28<sup>th</sup> and Faith Mills will be retiring on June 1, 2023. Stephanie Dejardin has joined the CLTS team who comes to us from the Youth Connection Center. Ashley Romanek joined the Court Services Division and will work with all participants in Treatment Court while also providing CCS service facilitation to those enrolled in CCS.  
Enrollment status reports – CCOP, CCS, and CST  
CLTS has 82 enrollments with all eligible for CCOP. There are 58 individuals enrolled in CCS/CST with only having 9 consumers age 18+ (85% youth). The age range of CCS/CST program participants is 5-44.
