## F. OLD BUSINESS

Kari Baumann reported on the testimony given with regards to the literacy bill presented in Madison. Joel Kitchens is strongly behind this bill which will mandate testing for children so as not to fall behind in their reading skills and to help them where improvement is needed. A few amendments might need to be made before it goes to the next committee for approval.

## G. NEW BUSINESS

### 2. Discussion on Youth with Co-occurring Disabilities

Discussion was had regarding ways to help children in the school with co-occurring disabilities. Schools need to identify where the child is struggling. Testing needs to be done in 4K in order to catch the kids that may have difficulty with reading. Preventative and proactive measures need to be discussed. Kari suggested setting up meetings with all the districts to see what can be done to help with this problem. Federal funding is available to schools to help. Suggestion was made of possibly a day of training and invite teachers to see what resources they might need to help the children that are struggling. Another suggestion was made regarding playing short educational games to help children. Make it fun and not work.

### 3. Enrollment Status Report

CCS/CST – There are 63 consumers enrolled in CCS. 45 of those consumers are enrolled in both CCS/CST and 1 consumer is enrolled in CST only due to not having Medicaid. 78% of those consumers are under the age of 18. Approximately 100% of youth are receiving special education in school.

CLTS/CCOP – There are 76 consumers enrolled. Just recently 2 have moved out of county. This year 39 consumers have been served with CCOP funding which is state funding to help fill in the gaps where CLTS can not cover.

### 4. Future agenda items – What would you like to focus on? Gaps in services? Other?

Beth informed the committee of a meeting taking place on October 21 at the PATH building for a parent support group for caregivers of children with varying abilities. They are planning of meeting quarterly and Beth would like to report on this at the committee meetings.

Nissa talked about guardianships that take place in court. Parents have to sit on one side of the court room while the child sits on the other side. Would like to have a speaker come to one of our meetings to discuss how we can make this more relaxing for the child. Many of the children with disabilities don't understand why they can't sit next to mom, dad, brother,

sister, etc. and it is very scary and stressful for them. Chairperson Moeller offered to discuss options with Register in Probate in Door County.
